- ❖ Conduct Ready For Operations (RFO) assessments & support other inspections (CLEAR, STAN, TSTA)



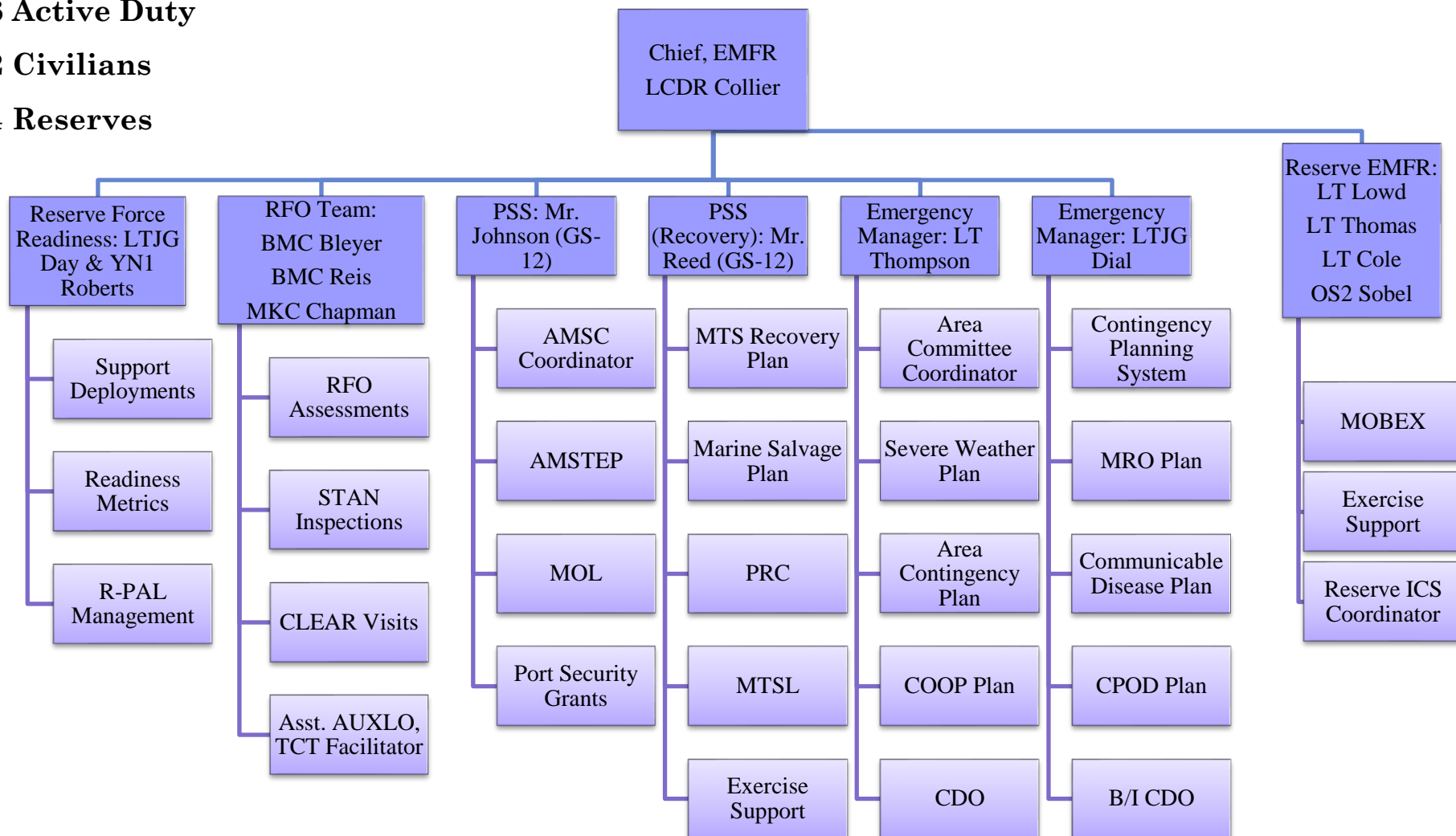

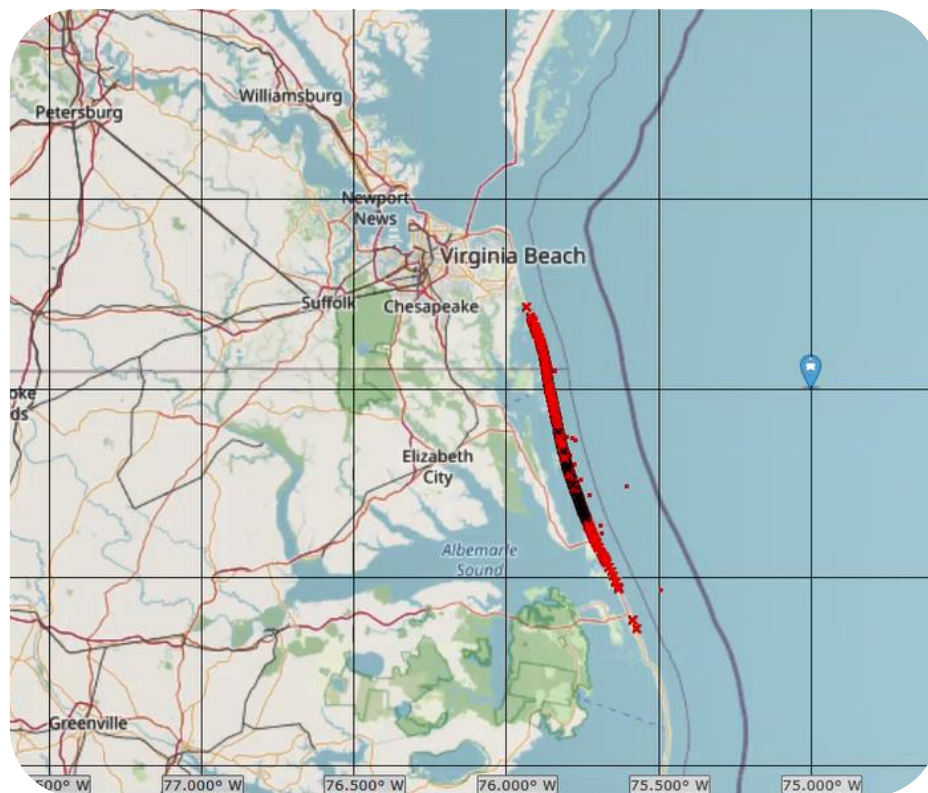

PREPEX

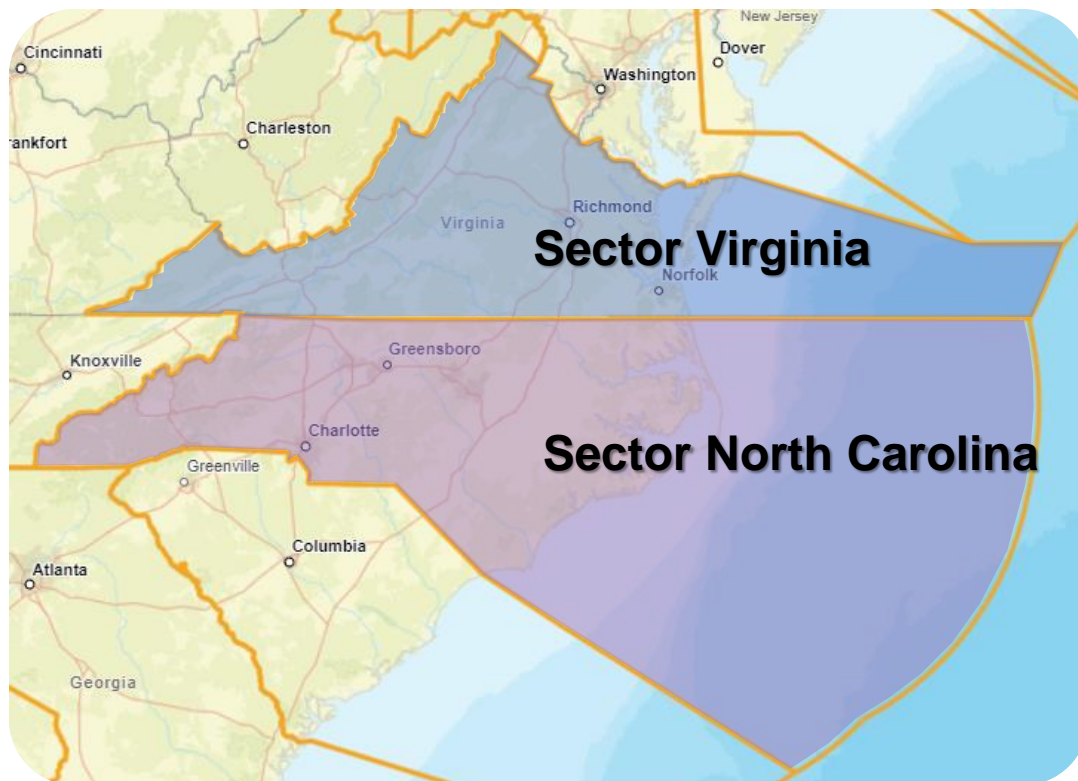
- M/V CAPE WASHINGTON collides with a submerged object 35nm off the coast of the VA – NC border and discharges 5,409 barrels of IFO 380 from one of the vessel's tanks.
 - *Incident location & shoreline impact trajectory shown.*





PREPEX

- 2 States
 - Virginia / North Carolina
- 2 Coast Guard Sectors
 - Can only have 1 designated FOSC
- 2 Regional Response Teams
 - RRT 3 & 4
- Multiple partners
 - 45 different agencies in attendance





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- **Top Concerns**
 - Access issues (security or remote areas).
 - Ecologically sensitive areas (habitat and wildlife).
 - Concerns & impacts to coastal communities and stakeholders.
 - Shortage or competing logistical support resources (e.g., lodging or food).
 - Local area knowledge and resources.
